1. **Amberley Village Human Rights Commission recommends that Amberley Village Council make the following land acknowledgement statement after reciting the pledge of allegiance at every village council meeting.**

Land Acknowledgement Resolution:

As a step toward honoring the truth and achieving healing and reconciliation with those Indigenous Peoples who were affected most by colonization and broken treaties, we acknowledge the traditional Shawnee and Myaamia (Miami) lands on which we now stand, and on which the Village of Amberley was built

2. **Amberley Village Human Rights Commission recommends that Amberley Village Council approve the following resolution**

EXPRESSING the Village of Amberley's support for the recognition of Indigenous Peoples Day to reflect upon the ongoing struggles of indigenous people of this land, and to celebrate the thriving culture and value that all indigenous people add to our community; and urging other organizations, and public entities to recognize Indigenous Peoples Day.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE VILLAGE OF AMBERLEY THAT:

Section 1. The second Monday in October shall be heretofore be known as Indigenous Peoples' Day in the Village of Amberley.

Section 2. The Village of Amberley strongly supports the proposition that Indigenous Peoples' Day shall be an opportunity to celebrate the thriving cultures and values of the Indigenous Peoples of our region.
