April 28, 2022

Prior Minutes:

The minutes from February 2 were approved with no changes.

Police Memorial Week Resolution:

The committee heard from Scot Lahrmer about proposed resolution 2022-?? Proclaiming the week of May 11-17, 2022 as National Law Enforcement Memorial Week and May 15, 2022 as Peace Officers' Memorial Day. Mr. Rosen moved to recommend to council the approval of this resolution. This was seconded by Mr. Bardach and approved by the committee.

Police-Fire Department Update:

Chief Wallace updated the committee on the Police-Fire Open House that took place the afternoon and evening of the committee meeting. He was very enthusiastic about the turn out to the first session with approximately 40 residents and 12 staff. He would like to work to make this a more common activity, as he sees the benefits of the positive relationships between residents and staff. It was noted by Mayor Muething that a number of residents clearly knew the officers, and that this already speaks highly of the relationship between the community and the Police/Fire staff.

Chief Wallace then updated the committee about the continued partnership with the Heroin Task force and the benefits that this allows for our officers financially and through experience and networking. Four members of the fire personnel completed in-person FDIC fire training during the week of April 25.

The final update was regarding the purchase of the new police cruiser. It was purchased and is being prepared, but delivery is not expected until near the end of the year. The two vehicles that were sold, did help offset the costs of outfitting the new cruiser by \$17,000.

Overall, the Chief is proud of how the department is running and is pleased with the continued growth of the staff.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

RE: Fire Department Motorola APX 6000XE Radios

ITEM: Authorizing the purchase of **8 Motorola APX 6000XE Radios** from Mobilcomm.

ACTION REQUESTED: By motion, adopt **Resolution 2022 - ??** To authorize a contract in the amount of \$27,990.96 to Mobilcomm. for the purchase of a firefighting radio that can withstand extreme environments. The estimate includes delivery, device programming and engraving.

PURPOSE: To replace firefighting radios that do not meet the current NFPA 1802 requirements for emergency personnel in a hazard zone. The APX 6000XE radios will be rated for 500 degree temps, have knobs for larger gloved hands, have higher audio levels and will meet the NFPA standard 1802. Additional features and benefits are:

Exaggerated Controls

Well-spaced knobs eliminate accidental activation and glove-friendly controls are big, recognizable and easy to distinguish.

Enlarged Top Display

Easy-to-read, in dark or low light.

X-Large Emergency Button

Largest emergency button in the industry with programmable 0-6 second time delay.

Universal PTT

Universal push-to-talk button with enhanced grooves is easy to find by "touch."

Optimized T-Grip

Innovative T-grip design gives you a secure grip and better control.

Full Size Keypad

Simple to navigate and use.

Color Display

High-contrast color display is easy-to-read in all kinds of light.
