Police/Fire Committee Minutes

March 5, 2024

The meeting was called to order at 5:00 PM. The minutes from December 6, 2023, were approved with no edits.

Chief Owens presented an EMS update. Overall, service continues to be strong, with 90% of runs taking 10:34 minutes with an average response of 6:05 minutes from the call in 2023. Amberley officers continue to respond to all calls as well. Reading EMS has continued to see an increase in runs, and as a result is in the process of adding an additional ambulance to help.

The second order of business included presenting a motion to recognize National Public Safety Telecommunications week in Amberley Village. Mr Bardach moved to recommend this to council, and it was approved unanimously.

The Village Manager and Lt. Blum then presented updates to the Heroin Task Force. The committee learned about the two grants that have been awarded to the Village to support the hiring of an additional member of the Heroin Task Force, as an Investigative Liaison, paid for by Hamilton County Public Health. That grant also covers the purchase of a vehicle. Mr Bardach moved to recommend this to council, and it was approved unanimously.

The Village Manager presented information about the purchase of a new vehicle for Lt Blum. Mr Bardach moved to recommend this to council, and it was approved unanimously.

Lieutenant Blum and Sergeant Schmidtgoessling presented a department update and spoke about the amount of Police overtime, and the continued investigations into recent robberies in the Village. The department will be looking for a new K9 to replace Officer Creed in the fall. We learned about the grant that was received for additional body cameras for officers. We also learned about a grant that was received to cover the costs of having additional officers on Friday/Saturday to help cover temples in the Village.

RESOLUTION NO.

PROCLAIMING THE WEEK OF MAY 12-18, 2024
AS NATIONAL LAW ENFORCEMENT MEMORIAL WEEK AND MAY 15, 2024
AS PEACE OFFICERS' MEMORIAL DAY

WHEREAS, The Congress and President of the United States have designated May 15 as Peace Officers' Memorial Day, and the week in which May 15 falls as National Police week; and

WHEREAS, the members of the Amberley Village Police Department play an essential role in safeguarding the rights and freedoms of the residents of the Amberley Village; and

WHEREAS, it is important that all citizens know and understand the duties, responsibilities, hazards, and sacrifices of their law enforcement agency, and that members of our Police Department recognize their duty to serve the people by safeguarding life and property and protecting them against violence and disorder,

WHEREAS, the men and women of the Amberley Village Police Department unceasingly provide a vital public service;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE Council of Amberley Village, Ohio, seven (7) members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1: That the Council of the Village of Amberley, Ohio hereby designates and proclaims the week of May 12-18, 2024 as "National Law Enforcement Memorial Week" and May 15, 2024 as "Peace Officers Memorial Day."

SECTION 2: That we call upon all citizens of the Village of Amberley and upon all patriotic, civic and educational organizations to observe the week of May 12 – May 18, 2024, as Police Week with appropriate ceremonies and observances in which all may join in commemorating law enforcement officers, past and present, who, by their faithful and loyal devotion to their responsibilities, have rendered a dedicated service to their communities and, in so doing, have established for themselves an enviable and enduring reputation for preserving the rights and security of all citizens.

SECTION 3: We further call upon all citizens of the Village of Amberley to observe Monday, May 15, as Peace Officers' Memorial Day in honor of those law enforcement officers who, through their courageous deeds, have made the ultimate

sacrifice in service to their community or have become disabled in the performance of duty, and let us recognize and pay respect to the survivors of our fallen heroes.

SECTION 4: That this Resolution shall take effect and be enforced from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
